Greetings and welcome to this week's newsletter.

A note from Linda

How wonderful it was to join you all for worship last Sunday - either onsite or online! There were 59 of us in the church building and up to 11 online at various times! What a fabulous time of worship. Praise be to God. A huge thanks to everyone who worked so hard to get everything ready: the building, the roster, the COVID-safe adjustments, the live-streaming and all the elements of the worship service. If attending worship onsite, I encourage you to approach the 'Zoom screen' at the back of the church before and after the service and interact with those who are connecting online. It's important to help everyone feel welcome and included wherever they are.

This Sunday happens to be my pre-arranged rostered quarterly Sunday off. I had already booked a trip to Kangaroo Island for the weekend before we decided to return to worship services in our building so I won't be able to join you. This week is the final in the *unraveled* series. The focus will be on the Samaritan Woman at the Well. What unraveling will occur in and through this story?

Meg Edwards will lead you and Dean Pearce will bring the Message. Do take a moment to check out the stunning flowers that Di Curtis has made!

I trust that it will be a special time of worship once again.

As we prepare to gather for worship onsite again, there are some important things to remember... Even though restrictions are easing, we still need to be vigilant with regard to our response to COVID-19. Let's do this as a demonstration of the love we have for one another.

- Please don't come if you are unwell.
- Wear warm clothes! We aren't kidding when we say you'll need this! We'll have the exhaust fans on and windows open to keep the air circulating this reduces the risks of COVID, especially as we will be singing.
- Avoid parking next to the top hall this space is still being used by Medical HQ.
- You are welcome to add to the community artwork for the last time before you enter the building.
- Once you enter, you will be welcomed with a warm *Hello*, and possibly an elbow or toe tap. (Please refrain from handshaking, kissing or hugging at church for the time being).
 Please remember that we are still being encouraged to maintain the physical distancing of 1.5 m when gathering with others outside of our immediate household.
 You'll be signed in (as we need to keep a record of attendance) and please use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Seating is spaced out to allow for physical distancing. Those who come from the same household can sit together (if you wish to!)
- The Offering will be received at the end of the service. A receptacle will be provided near the exit. We continue to encourage regular giving through direct debit or electronic transfer.
- Morning tea will not be provided this week. We encourage you to connect with others by either having a
 coffee at a local café to support their business (many of our folk frequent Caffe Settebello and the Rezz on
 Sundays) or consider inviting others to share a coffee in your home.

Cleaning Supplies

Disposable Gloves, Anti-bacterial Cleaning Wipes, Disinfectant, Toilet Cleaner and Floor Cleaner for cleaning have been placed in the Cleaning Cupboard in the disabled toilet. There is a black key box stuck (magnetic) to the side of this cupboard. Please pick up the key box, depress the two buttons on the sides to pop open the lid and access the key. Please access these supplies if you have a volunteer role that requires cleaning or wiping down surfaces. There is also some anti-bacterial spray, wipes and Handy Andy Floor Cleaner located in the cleaning cupboard in the lower hall [(if you can get past the child safety lock (press buttons on side and slide)]. The mop for use in the bathrooms is located in the corner of the disabled toilet. There are also mops in the lower hall cleaning cupboard for use in the lower hall which need to remain here, along with some floor cleaner, for use by one of our hirers.

President's Conference

"Called by God - living our Christian vocation in our daily life"

October 2-5, 2020, U-City: 43 Franklin Street, Adelaide

The theme of the conference is Christian vocation. One of the core themes of the Uniting Church is "every member ministry". We will explore what this looks like in its many forms, from local churches through to Uniting Church agencies and schools through to faithful people serving in and living out their Christian discipleship in their relationships, families, communities and daily life.

You can join the conference in one of three ways.

1. In Adelaide at U-city. There will a limit on the number of people who can gather here, we continue to monitor guidelines as to how many this can be (currently 75 people are allowed), if the current 4m2 per person continues, we can have a maximum of 80 attendees. The cost is \$250 plus \$10 processing fee

2. In hubs. We are hoping to offer at least one hub in each state where people can gather and participate in the conference in a group of 8-12.. More information about hubs will be available soon. The cost is \$75 plus \$10 processing fee

3. Online. You will be able to livestream the conference into your home and be able to join in a virtual group for discussion. The cost is \$75 plus \$10 processing fee.

Revision of volunteer roles during worship

We have reviewed some of the volunteer roles in the light of covid-safe recommendations for churches. Most of our traditional roles will remain very similar to what they were before but you may find some things slightly different e.g. where you stand, no hugging/handshakes at the door, following hand hygiene, social distancing and additional cleaning on pack-up to name a few. Other changes are more significant and currently still under review by Church Council e.g. communion, morning tea, offering, counting money etc. We will update you on the changes to these procedures if relevant to you as a volunteer when we can, and they may change with time. In the meantime, if you have volunteered to help in one of the following areas then please take note of any additional tasks we may have added. If any of the changes mentioned means that you can no longer take on the role then please notify Carol in the office ASAP.

Building Steward:

- Should arrive early at 8.15 am to open up the front door and all other doors including the rear escape door so the building is open and ready for our worship team to begin rehearsal at 8.30am. Don't forget to sign in!
- Switch on lights, heaters, A/C as needed throughout building. Can go home once worship musicians arrive.
- At the end of the service the building steward should work to assist the 'volunteer cleaner' in wiping down all light switches, door handles and frequently touched surfaces with anti-bacterial wipes or a disinfectant solution as they reverse the procedure above and close up the building. Don't forget to sign out when you leave.

Chair Stewards – setting up and packing up chairs:

- Ensure hands are clean by using hand sanitiser or gloves and then,
- Set-up the chairs for the service (Jeff Dry is suggesting any time after 1 pm on Saturday could work)
- Pack-up the chairs after the service on Sunday, wiping down any chair-arms with an anti-bacterial wipes prior to putting them away.
- Don't forget to sign in if arriving/leaving outside of the main service time i.e. when our tick and flick volunteers are not present.

Volunteer Cleaning Steward:

- After the service, this person is responsible for wiping down all touched surfaces such as tables, door handles, the hand-rail to the stage and light switches etc. (in collaboration with building steward)
- Clean the toilets and wipe down all taps and doors of the bathrooms, if used during or after the service

Production (Sound):

- In addition to your normal roles, you will need to ensure your hands are sanitised prior to setting up the sound equipment
- You will also need to clean the lectern and microphone, sound equipment and sound desk, with antibacterial wipes, or as is appropriate to each device, as you pack up and put things away.

Tick and Flick Attendance Stewards:

- This role will now be formalised on the roster as it's a formal requirement of our covid-safe plan
- For those known to our congregation, mark people as present using tick and flick, as previously [alternately, we are considering using a tablet to enter this information directly into elvanto (Paul Howland to advise)]
- For visitors, you need to ensure they provide their name and contact details (phone number/email address) in the visitor's book (or on a visitors form). Unfortunately visitors cannot attend our services if they don't provide this contact information. Hand them a Welcome Pack when you greet them as well.

Door Greeters

- As per previous role but no hugs or close contact. Come up with another creative way to say hello toe-tap, elbow bump, wave or smile.
- Ensure people use hand sanitiser on entry and direct to tick and flick for marking attendance
- Place offering box on the table near the entrance prior to sitting down for the service.

If you are part of the worship team or a volunteer who arrives outside of the normal arrival time of the majority of morning worshipers then <u>you will still need to</u> sign in via the visitor's book and write down your time of arrival/departure from the site in order to ensure we are still meeting our covid-safe plan re monitoring attendance times. We thank you for understanding that these changes are to keep all in community at AUC as safe and healthy as possible! *Carol Lang (on behalf of our Roster Coordinating Team)*
