Greetings to you in the name of Christ!

This is a sad time for us as a church community. We grieve with Eric Hurrell following the passing of Barbara. A lady with a huge heart, we will miss her. Plans are under way for a funeral - a time to celebrate her life. It is likely that this will be held next Wednesday afternoon (July 8). More details will be available soon and will be sent to the congregation via email.

As plans are put in place for us to gather again in our building on July 19, we will continue to worship with resources to use at home and via Zoom. This week in our unraveling series, we'll look at what happens when humans unravel God's plans for justice through the story of Pharaoh hardening his heart to Moses' requests. (Exodus 5:1-2; 7:8-23) Moses follows God's plan—to stand up for justice for the Israelites. He was determined to demand what was right and not give up the fight. However, Pharaoh had another plan—to keep the Israelites as slaves. How do we press onward when we receive repeated no's? What do we do when broken systems—created by human sin—unravel God's plans for liberation and justice? How can we counter the myth of scarcity by living a liturgy of abundance?

Looking ahead to July 19: Soon after we suspended our worship services, I sent a letter to congregation members which included a piece of purple velvet. This was a piece from the long purple cloth we had in Church to represent our Lenten journey. I suggested that you keep it with your candle as another reminder of the Church family that you are connected to. Do you still have it? My hope is that we can all bring our piece of purple cloth back on the 19th as a symbol of us gathering back together. If you no longer have yours or didn't get one, please let me know by text or email. I will gladly provide a replacement for you before the 19th.

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. (2 Cor 13:14)
