Christmas Services

At its meeting last Tuesday, Church Council endorsed the decision to hold 3 services this Christmas at the following times:

6.30 pm Christmas Eve, 24th Dec – Family Focus

9.00 pm Christmas Eve, 24th Dec – Carol's and Candles

9.30 am Christmas Day, 25th Dec – Christmas Celebration Service

We need to be aware of possible number restrictions if the current COVID situation remains and as such Church Council is interested in gauging an idea of possible numbers for each service. So over the next weeks we are asking people to nominate which service they are likely to attend. We have placed a list of all our congregation members in the foyer and you are asked to indicate on this list which service you are thinking about attending so we can get some estimate of possible numbers. This will help us know how many seats we will require.

Worship on-site

It is great that we have been able to come together to worship face to face again this Sunday because it was not looking very likely during the lockdown period. It is also very exciting that we can welcome Rev Sue Ellis as our preacher. Sue commenced her supply ministry this week and we are very much looking forward to sharing the next month with Sue. Please pray for Sue as she commences her ministry with us.

It is so important for us to remain vigilant with regard to our response to COVID-19.

As you prepare to come to worship onsite, here are some important things to remember...

- Please don't come if you are unwell or if you have been in any of the high risk locations at times identified by SA Health.
- Think about wearing a mask, although this isn't mandatory it is one more thing we can do to keep others and ourselves safe in enclosed spaces.
- Wear warm clothes! We'll have the exhaust fans on and windows open to keep the air circulating this reduces the risks of COVID, especially as we will be singing.
- Avoid parking next to the top hall this space is still being used by Medical HQ.
- Once you enter, you will be welcomed with a warm *Hello*, and possibly an elbow or toe tap. (Please refrain from handshaking, kissing or hugging at church for the time being).
 Please remember that we are still being encouraged to maintain the physical distancing of 1.5 m when gathering with others outside of our immediate household.
 You'll be signed in (as we need to keep a record of attendance) and please use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Seating is spaced out to allow for physical distancing. Those who come from the same household can sit together (if you wish to!)
- The Offering will be received at the end of the service. A receptacle will be provided near the exit. We continue to encourage regular giving through direct debit or electronic transfer.
- Morning tea will not be provided. We encourage you to connect with others by either having a coffee at a local café to support their business (many of our folk frequent Caffe Settebello and the Rezz on Sundays) or consider inviting others to share a coffee in your home.
- We encourage you to approach the 'Zoom screen' at the back of the church before and after the service and interact with those who are connecting online. It's important for us to help everyone feel welcome and included wherever they are.

Church Activities

Please note that under the current restrictions we are required to observe a density of 1 person per 4 sq meters at our church services and related church activities. This means we are now able to resume our regular church activities provided they meet this new 1 to 4 ruling. It is possible that on December 1 the restrictions will be further lifted and so we need to await the decisions on how this might impact our church community. We will update our church community through the email database as soon as we know more.

Frontier Services

We were fortunate to be able to enjoy a message last Sunday from Rev Sunil Kadaparambil (Sunny) from Frontier Services as part of our worship at home service. It was so disappointing that for the second time we have had to postpone Sunny as our guest preacher because of COVID restrictions. Sunny was so cooperative in meeting our request to present his planned message as a video production which hopefully most of the congregation were able to view. Normally we would have provided the opportunity for the congregation to make a retiring offering in support of the work of Frontier Services but as this was not possible Church Council has agreed to make a donation instead. With the COVID impact the church has not been able to conduct its normal fundraising efforts to support the Mission Outreach and so Church Council sees this as an opportunity to make a contribution to support at least one of the Mission Outreach projects. Individuals may also wish to make their own personal donation and so if this is the case then please place your donation in an envelope marked Frontier Services and place in the Offering Box over the coming Sundays.

A note for Chair Stewards regarding Dec 2020 and Jan 2021

We are working with our hirers to determine what dates they will be using the auditorium over the Dec/Jan period. We hope to be able to give our chair stewards a break from packing-up and setting-up chairs whilst the auditorium is otherwise not in use by hirers. Pilates will be using the auditorium as a once-off on Tuesday 1st Dec due to the Wirra Play Day and so chairs will definitely need to be packed away on Sunday 29th Nov. Waratah Calisthenics who otherwise normally use the auditorium throughout the week are currently awaiting news regarding whether or not they can resume classes after the 1st Dec or not. They were due to finish up their 2020 season on Sunday 6th Dec with an end of year concert, which has now been cancelled. As a result they may decide to extend their classes for an additional week until 13th Dec in order to do smaller trophy presentations, if government restrictions permit.
