	Activity	Equipment	Explanation
Open up Set up	Kurna welcome “ <u>Niina marni</u> ” (you good)	Some words have been accessed on English-Kurna Warra Dictionary Online Free Translation	Remember the emphasis on <u>1st</u> and <u>3rd</u> syllables. Children love new words/sounds so have a go!
Activity 1 <i>Fine Motor/Play dough</i>	Festival Christmas table wirra	Playdough, foil plate, collection of leaves, seedpods, tinsel, candle(optional)	Collect pine, pods, holly, ivy etc. Make a centre piece for your table (see pdf)
Activity 2 <i>Fine Motor/Craft</i>	Make a Christmas Chain Make a paper plate wreath	Cards, ruler/pencil, scissors, tape/stapler Paper plate, green/red paper, glitter, glue stick, ribbon, pdf attached	Rule, cut, card strips. Tape/link into a chain. Cut centre from plate. Decorate edge with torn paper etc. Attach a ribbon and hang.
Activity 3 Sensory/ Social Out door/nature activities	Let’s read! Paint and paste a Christmas tree Nativity sensory play What happens when the ice melts? Make mince pies	Library books/street library Card, blue/yellow paint, assorted decorations, glue stick or craft glue Nativity figures, hay, toy animals, box Nature objects, food dye, containers, tub/water, scoops/spoons, sieves etc Pots/water, spoons, pie cases/trays, seed pods, leaves, flowers etc	Read a book in your own cosy corner Enjoy finger painting, dry then paste on decorations (see pdf) Use home-made or bought nativity figures Collect then put nature objects, water and dye in different size containers. Freeze then put in tub of water. Make mud/mince pies to share in the wardli
Activity 4 <i>Gross motor/Social</i>	Bowl a Christmas tree Ride a box train or sleigh	10 green plastic cups/tins, unbreakable ornament, balls (variety of sizes) Boxes, teddies, wrapped “gifts”	Build cups/tins into a pyramid and place ornament on top. Roll the balls and bowl over. Use large boxes as a train/sleigh. Fill and play.
Activity 5 <i>Snack</i>	Healthy Christmas trees and wreaths	Fruit, cheese, salad vegetables, herbs	Create your own Christmas tree or wreath with your favourite healthy foods
