A Note from Linda

Niina marni!

This Sunday we will celebrate both Trinity Sunday and Reconciliation Sunday.

Trinity Sunday is a celebration of who God is for us: Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Reconciliation Sunday is the first Sunday of National Reconciliation Week (held 27 May – 3 June each year). For the past fourteen years, the Synod of South Australia has encouraged this celebration as one way of continuing to recognise the Covenant between the Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress (UAICC) and the Uniting Church in Australia. Reconciliation Sunday encourages us to participate in one of the major themes of our Christian faith: God was in Christ reconciling the world. We too can contribute to this reconciling by developing mutually respectful relationships between First and Second Peoples within our congregation, the wider church and wider community.

Reconciliation is an important issue in the Australian context. The Uniting Church in Australia remains on a journey of reconciliation with First Peoples. And because the Trinity evokes the theme of community and relationships and restoring human relationships as a part of God's reconciling mission in our world, the two belong together.

This week, as we gather to worship, we acknowledge the Kaurna Peoples, the first inhabitants of this place from time beyond remembering. We acknowledge that through this land, God nurtured and sustained the First Peoples of this country, the Aboriginal and Islander peoples. We honour them for their custodianship of the land on which we gather. We acknowledge that the First Peoples had already encountered the Creator God before the arrival of the colonisers; the Spirit was already in the land, revealing God to the people through law, custom and ceremony. We acknowledge that the same love and grace that was finally and fully revealed in Jesus Christ sustained the First Peoples and gave them particular insights into God's ways; and so we rejoice in the reconciling purposes of God found in the good news about Jesus Christ.

If you are planning to join us on Sunday morning (whether onsite or online), I encourage you to bring a gum leaf or two with you.

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Worship on-site

It is so important for us to remain vigilant with regard to our response to COVID-19. As you prepare to come to worship onsite, here are some important things to remember...

Every person who attends activities on our church property is now required to register their attendance by using the COVID SAfe Check-In where at all possible. This is a government requirement, so please ensure you bring your mobile phones to church. A sign in sheet will be available when use of the QR code is absolutely impossible. Please don't come if you are unwell or if you have been in any of the high risk locations at times identified by SA Health.

Think about wearing a mask, although this isn't mandatory it is one more thing we can do to keep others and ourselves safe in enclosed spaces.

Also remember to:

- Wear warm clothes! We'll have the exhaust fans on and windows open to keep the air circulating.
- Avoid parking next to the top hall this space is still being used by Medical HQ.
- Once you enter, you will be welcomed with a warm *Hello*, and possibly an elbow or toe tap. (Please refrain from handshaking, kissing or hugging at church for the time being). Please remember that we are still being encouraged to maintain the physical distancing of 1.5 m when gathering with others outside of our immediate household. Please use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Seating is spaced out to allow for physical distancing. Those who come from the same household can sit together.
- The Offering will be received at the end of the service. A receptacle will be provided near the exit. We continue to encourage regular giving through direct debit or electronic transfer.
- Morning tea will not be provided. We encourage you to connect with others by either having a coffee at a local café to support their business (many of our folk frequent Caffe Settebello and the Rezz on Sundays) or consider inviting others to share a coffee in your home.
- We encourage you to approach the 'Zoom screen' at the back of the church before and after the service and interact with those who are connecting online. It's important for us to help everyone feel welcome and included wherever they are.

Strategic Plan Update

Strategic Plan Stage 1 - As you will be aware Church Council has been working on a new Strategic Plan for the past 12 months and at our AGM in February the draft Plan was endorsed by the members. Further revision of the Plan has occurred and as such the extensive list of action items have been reduced down and prioritised. While much of the Strategic Plan will be the responsibility of Church Council to implement, Church Council is now seeking the support and assistance of members of the congregation to 'play their part' in helping bring this Strategic Plan to life. The Strategic Plan priorities provide an opportunity for members of the congregation to volunteer their time and gifts to action specific priority areas that Church Council believes have a broader church community responsibility. In the attached document to this week's newsletter you will find a copy of the revised Strategic Plan Stage 1 and it highlights those priority items in which Church Council is seeking Expressions of Interest (EOI) from the congregation. Church Council Update from meeting held Tuesday 25th May

- While it has been decided not to conduct the Christmas Tree Festival in 2021 Council has not ruled out running the festival in future years if the interest is there and a coordinator can be found. Council wishes to acknowledge the tremendous work of Julie Goldsmith in coordinating this event over the past years.
- The implementation of the Strategic Plan will occur in the coming months hopefully with members of the congregation having indicated their interest in assisting with the areas of responsibility for the priority strategies.
- The success of the Messy Church program was acknowledged, with the highlight being that currently there are 96 people (children, parents, grandparents, leaders and volunteers) that have attended a session during the past 2 years. Huge thanks to the leadership team and the numerous volunteers that assist.
- A small sub-committee is meeting next week to finalise designs for new signage at the front of the church

What do you do with plastic bread tags?

Are you passionate about recycling? Would you like to make a difference?

We are pleased to announce that we are supporting the charity Aussie Bread tags for Wheelchairs.

How does it work? We collect up our plastic bread tags and bring them in to Church. (You'll find a container in the Church Entry). The tags are collected and sent to recyclers in Robe. The recyclers (Transmutation) make a donation for the tags. These donations fund wheelchairs for disadvantaged people, currently in South Africa. Transmutation makes door knobs, coasters, bowls, cheese boards, clocks and pens from the bread tags.
