	<b>Activity</b>	<b>Equipment</b>	<b>Explanation</b>
<b>Introduction</b>	Kurna welcome “ <u>Niina marni</u> ” (you good)	Some words have been accessed on English-Kurna Warra Dictionary Online Free Translation	Remember the emphasis on <u>1<sup>st</sup></u> and <u>3<sup>rd</sup></u> syllables. Children love new words/sounds so have a go!
<b>Activity 1</b> <i>Fine Motor/Play dough</i>	Make an echidna	Playdough/clay, small sticks	Mould body and snout, then poke in sticks
<b>Activity 2</b> <i>Fine Motor/Craft</i>	Make a bird mask	<b>Pdf</b> , egg carton, scissors, paint, elastic or string	Cut egg carton, paint, dry, add elastic or string ties
<b>Activity 3</b> Sensory/ Social <b>Out door/nature activities</b>	Let’s read! Fly like a bird Paint and paste with feathers  Make a home for the animals  Make a rock reptile or fish	Library books, mat, pillows Mask, scarves Paint/brushes, paste, feathers  Toy animals, small sticks/stones, leaves, grass, water/tray or cellophane paper, <b>pdf</b> Stones, paint optional, <b>pdf</b>	Set up your own cosy corner. Put on your mask, add wings/tail scarves. Add paste to paint, paint then add feathers (can buy from Spotlight or cheap shops) <b>Outside or</b> inside whatever the weather dictates. Create an animal habitat. <b>Create a rock creature wherever you are!</b>
<b>Activity 4</b> <i>Gross motor/Social</i>	Jump like a kangaroo Climb a tree Explore the wombat burrow	Chalk and/or hoops Find a climbing tree or visit a playground Table, blanket, boxes, chairs etc, <b>pdf</b>	<b>Draw footprints, use hoops or just jump!</b> <b>Are you a bird, possum or lizard?</b> Make your tunnel then explore!
<b>Activity 5</b> <i>Snack</i>	Possum food Possums are mainly herbivores (plant eaters).	Plate and fruit, flowers and leaves. They like leaves, buds, flowers, nectar and fruits, but also eat insects and snails.	Prepare fruit and decorate platter with flowers or leaves. Enjoy your fruit snack!
<b>Activity 6</b> <i>Story/Music</i>	Song/Story	YouTube Feathers Fur or Fins...Don Spencer/Music for Kids (series using drawings, videos of captive and wild animals, songs, narrated/sung by Don)	Choose from emu, kookaburra, platypus, wombat, lizards of Oz and many more!
