Worship on-site

It is so important for us to remain vigilant with regard to our response to COVID-19.

Every person who attends activities on our church property is required to register their attendance by using the COVID SAfe Check-In. Please ensure you bring your mobile phones to church. A sign in sheet will be available when use of the QR code is <u>absolutely impossible</u>. Please ensure you print your name and phone number neatly so that it can be read by contact tracers.

Please don't come if you are unwell or if you have been in any high risk locations identified by SA Health. Please **wear a mask** unless you have a valid reason not to wear one. This is currently a mandatory requirement for indoor public spaces, including our church building.

Given the ever changing covid restrictions we are doing our best to keep the congregation informed as things change. Currently we have a density ruling of 1 person per 2 sq metres, masks must be worn and seated morning tea is allowed.

Season of Creation

During September, Christians around the world take part in acts of worship and actions focused on how we live in relationship with, and care for, God's creation. The international theme for the 2021 Season of Creation is *a home for all? Renewing the Oikos of God*. Oikos is the Greek word for "home," or "household." The theme calls us to reflect on the integral web of relationships that sustain the Earth, our common home.

Blessing of the Animals

Our Season of Creation will culminate with a Blessing of the Animals service on Sunday October 3rd.

Linked to Saint Francis Sunday, there is a growing tradition of churches hosting Blessing of the Animals services. It is a time to show our gratitude for the animals that have graced our lives. This is the first time in many years that that we will be having such a service. It will be a wonderful way for us to build connections with our local community and our world.

Campbelltown Council has given us permission to hold the service at Lovell Reserve on Ryan Avenue. We will be inviting people from the community to join us.

All will be invited to bring along their pets or a picture of an animal they love or an endangered species they care about. All animals must be on a lead or in a secure pen for the safety of other animals and humans.

This service will take the place of our morning service and will be held at the slightly later time of 10am.

There will be a special Offering for the Animal Welfare League. People are invited to give:

gifts of cash or

blankets for cats, or

treats and toys for dogs or cats.

What do you do with plastic bread tags?

Are you passionate about recycling? Would you like to make a difference?

We are supporting the charity Aussie Bread tags for Wheelchairs.

How does it work? We collect up our plastic bread tags and bring them in to Church. (You'll find a container in the Church Entry when we are back worshipping together). The tags are collected and sent to recyclers in Robe. The recyclers (Transmutation) make a donation for the tags. These donations fund wheelchairs for disadvantaged people, currently in South Africa. Synod Resourcing Expo Events: Chasing the Wind of the Spirit:

Commencing this Saturday the Synod is holding six expo events throughout South Australia. These free events are being designed to be engaging, enabling and will act as a catalyst for the church. It will include speakers both from within and beyond the church in South Australia and a host of workshops and information that will help us all to take another step in pursuing God's plans for the church.

The theme of 'Chasing the wind of the Spirit', speaks to God's activity already occurring around us and the Spirit calling us to follow to where God's mission is taking the church; making disciples to be part of God's mission in congregations and through connections with local communities. To quote Paul Dearborn, 'It's not the church of God that has a mission; it is the God of Mission who has a church.'

The Synod is planning six events commencing on September 18th with an Expo at Adelaide West Uniting Church before travelling to five regional areas in October and early November. It is imagined that these events will take on a 'fair-like atmosphere' warmly welcoming everyone. Food vendors and community groups are encouraged to participate with stalls during the breaks. These free events are open to church groups and individuals who may or may not be regularly involved in church. We aim to connect people while at the same time resourcing them in areas of interest and passion.

This is a milestone event for our Synod. It is not just another conference or meeting. It is an opportunity not to be missed. The church was never supposed to be just for Sundays, it is a pursuit of a higher purpose that connects with our world, an opportunity to identify and partner in God's mission locally. God's mission is exciting and will take us to places that we never imagined.
