Welcome to worship this morning.

A note from Paul

Last week in the newsletter, I mentioned that the focus gospel for this year of the Revised Common Lectionary, Year C, is the Gospel of Luke.

Here are three things that might help us in our experience of exploring this gospel:

The gospel of Luke is a two-volume work. It consists of the gospel itself and of the Book of Acts. Both were written by the same author, and, in many ways, they mirror each other. For example, Luke begins with the birth of Jesus, Acts, with the birth of the Church. The gospel is a story of the journey from the obscurity of Galilee to the centre of the Jewish world, Jerusalem. Acts is a story of the journey from the relative obscurity of Palestine to the centre of the known world, Rome.

Luke's two volume work was written about three generations after the events of which it speaks and was written in and for a multi-cultural, multi-class, sophisticated urban setting – quite probably the city of Antioch.

Although the author of Luke has the Gospel of Mark as a major source, the author tones down some of Mark's rebelliousness. Luke presents Jesus as someone who observes the traditions of faith and culture and yet goes beyond them. Luke uses old language to say new things. Jesus calls this pouring new wine into old wineskins (Luke5:37-38).

Luke pays particular attention to the complexity of urban society, to the role of women, to food and the customs around eating, to the nature of friendship and patronage relationships, and to the disparities of wealth and poverty.

In both the gospel and Acts people are challenged by different cultures, different and changing norms, and by the clash of cultural and religious ideas. These challenges are exemplified by Peter's experience in Acts 10, where he finally realises that the particular experience that he and the other disciples have had of Jesus, is a universal and universalising experience.

The Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts have so much to explore for people in twenty-first century western, urban culture.

NOTICES FOR MEMBERS

Safety Issue - Chair and Table Storage in the Lower Hall

Please ensure you follow the directions on the sign in the lower hall (near office door) when putting away tables and chairs. There is a picture there to show you where & what to do. They need to be stacked against the wall to the office (in corner by the windows) and not in front of the ramp as they used to be. The small square tables need to be folded up and stored against the wall with the chair stacks (no more than 7 or 8 high) in front of them. The small tables have previously toppled over on unsuspecting hall users – so this is obviously a health and safety issue. It is important we follow these revised storage procedures to prevent it happening again to anyone. Note that all larger tables are now stored in the meeting room.

Please remove all rubbish and clean after all your activities

Please always remember to empty all indoor bins and sweep and mop (or vacuum) all floor surfaces after any activities in the church building. We have mice at the moment so this is particularly important. If we wish to keep the building rodent and insect free then we need to clean after each activity. **Please never assume** our cleaner will be cleaning that area before the next hall user. Always leave the building as you found it, if not better!
