Welcome to worship this morning.

A note from Paul

There are two kinds of people in the world, so the joke goes, those who say there are two kinds of people in the world and those who say there are not.

Our reading for this week from Luke chapter 10 seems to be a two kinds of people story, at least that's the way we have often told it. We have Mary who is spiritual and Martha who is practical and, the story goes, there is conflict between them.

During the Middle Ages, some people saw this story as a representation of the relationship between priests who worked in churches the community – Marthas, and monks and nuns who lived secluded lives of prayer and contemplation – Marys.

This seems like such a neat and easy way to see things. And who doesn't want a little more simplicity and order in the world? And, while a fundamentalist approach to faith, politics, relationships or any other area of life might have its attractions – having some things set in concrete that no longer need our attention, we know, even in our own experience, that life is messy, that categories don't stay fixed, that certainties can quickly lose their certainty.

The world, individual human beings, and this text, are far more complex than a simply binary division allows for.

I think it is instructive that the ancient manuscripts we have of the Gospel of Luke do not all agree on the words of the final verse of our text, Luke 10:42. In response to Martha's worry and distraction, Jesus either says, 'one thing is needed,' 'few things are needed,' 'few things are needed—or only one,' or 'but few things are needed—indeed only one.' This ambivalence in the manuscripts invites us, I think, into a deeper meditation on what is essential in our lives, what is at the heart of who we are, what it is within us that opens us up to the mystery of being made in the image of God.

Our answers will not be simplistic, although they might well have simplicity to them. They will not be definitive, although they will contain deep certainties. They will not be easily put into words, although we may be able to sing, dance, walk, dream or paint our way into them... *Paul*

July 2022 - Covid Update for Congregations

Given the rising prevalence of COVID-19 in our community, SA Health has launched a mask campaign. As a result, from 13th July 2022, The Uniting Church Synod of SA are again **strongly encouraging congregations to consider mask wearing in worship,** especially as they walk to their seats and when singing.

The full letter received from the Synod of SA can be found at the end of this newsletter and will be reviewed by Church Council in due course. Currently mask wearing is not mandated, but is strongly recommended for indoor gatherings such as occur in places of worship.

When attending in person, please continue to care for the safety of others and don't attend worship or large group activities at church in person if you are unwell or if you have been notified that you are a close contact for covid-19.

You are strongly encouraged to continue with hand sanitizing and social distancing (no hugging or handshakes).

From the Associate General Secretary

13th July 2022

Dear UCA Congregation.

Given the rising prevalence of COVID-19 in our community, SA Health has launched a mask campaign.

The community is reminded of the **mandatory** mask requirements in high risk settings such as hospitals, aged care facilities, and disability care facilities, as well as passenger transport.

In South Australia, it is still mandatory to wear a mask in:

- passenger transport (public transport, taxis, rideshare)
- hospitals and health care
- pharmacies
- aged care facilities
- disability care facilities

Close contacts must also wear a mask when they leave the house for 7 days after their exposure.

The campaign **recommends** that people should wear a mask in crowded indoor places where they cannot physically distance.

- shopping centres and retail
- workplaces
- entertainment venues (e.g. libraries, cinema, theatre, live music)
- sporting events
- places of worship
- bars and restaurants (when not eating or drinking)
- community centres and libraries

Face masks are important to help stop the spread of COVID-19 and other viruses like the flu. Children under 12 years of age do not need to wear a mask.

We strongly encourage congregations to consider mask wearing in worship, especially as they walk to their seats and when singing,

We ask for your help with promoting the use of masks in the community through your networks and communication channels, such as social media.

The Australian Government Department of Health has translated fact sheets available about when to wear a mask and how to use a mask properly.
