MISSIONAL

It is knitted angels season!

Each year we 'yarn bomb' our local neighbourhood with knitted (or crocheted) Christmas angels bringing hope and joy.

Why do we knit angels? This is an important part of our mission: to build connections with our community.

In the stories of Jesus' birth, we are told how angels - God's messengers - came to bring people good news at times when they were often confused or anxious. Our prayer is that as people find their angels, they will know that God is with them, because of the message of good news which will be attached.

We would love anyone to get involved – whether you are a novice knitter, an accomplished crocheter, or willing to learn!

Help yourself to a pattern and some wool from the Giving Table.

In the next few weeks, knit or crochet an Angel or 2 or 3 and bring them in.

If you are not a knitter, you might be willing to donate some wool or cash to buy wool or needles). Or share a pattern and wool with someone you know who loves to knit or crochet

We will commission the angels on December 18th, so that they can be distributed in the week leading up to Christmas. We hope that they will bring a smile to the faces of those who find them, just as they bring joy to those who make them!

Update from Operation Christmas Child

Firstly, from the national team - We want to express our gratitude to everyone who packed and dropped-off shoeboxes this season, hundreds of thousands of children will be blessed by your generosity and will have the opportunity to hear about Jesus!

And then more locally from Alison Elliss, Last Monday evening the Campbelltown Council adopted a proposal put by Councillor Dom Barbaro to donate \$500 towards Operation Christmas Child shoebox storage and transport costs. Councillor Barbaro's proposal was based in significant part on the fact that several community groups operating within the Council area, including Langton Park Retirement Village and Rostrevor Baptist, Athelstone Uniting and St. Martins Anglican Churches are involved in the project. We are awaiting contact from Council staff to arrange for this donation to be presented.

There are several other Churches within the Campbelltown area that have also supported Operation Christmas Child for many years. Trinity Church Campbelltown, the Church of Jesus Christ Firle, and St. Georges Anglican Magill. This is a wonderful blessing for Operation Christmas Child, our sincere thanks to Councillor Dom Barbaro for his proposal and that the Council has supported OCC in this way!

At this point SA and NT are sending 18,500 shoeboxes which are at present likely to go to the Philippines, but this destination may change, so I will keep you informed.
