1. As has been communicated over the past weeks, Jeff Dry has been following up several possible options for our supply minister and he can now advise that the Rev Ken Wright has accepted our invitation to commence with us from mid July as a 0.6 appointment. This is exciting news. Here is a short summary about Ken.

My name is Ken Wright. I'm an active retired (73yrs) ordained minister worshiping with the Playford Uniting Church congregation. I'm married to Sue who is the Secretary of the Playford UC Mission Council. We have 3 children and 9 grandchildren with one Family at Hope Valley, another at Victor Harbor and the third in Wagga Wagga. We live in Craigmore SA. After 25yrs as a Mechanical Instrument Maker and Senior Technical Officer at WRE Salisbury I candidated and trained for Ministry within the UCA. I have served as a Lay Pastor in Elizabeth, and as an Ordained minister at Campbelltown (1999), Port Pirie (2003) and Salisbury (2010) retiring in February 2016. Since then I have served multiple ways at Playford UC, and in Supply Ministry with the Gawler, Dernancourt and Para Vista congregations.

The Voice

During this year, Australians will be asked to consider supporting a Voice to Parliament for the First Nations of our country. Through a referendum we will be asked to support a constitutionally enshrined First Nations Voice. Rev Mark Kickett, National Interim Chair of the Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress notes: 'A constitutionally enshrined Voice will shape and guide the relationship between First and Second Peoples in this country by enabling our people to have a say in the decisions that impact our communities.' Our Uniting Church members, along with other Australians, are engaging in the conversation about a First Nations Voice and The Uluru Statement from the Heart.
