Scripture Focus

In Exodus 14:19–31 the storyteller shows that God is responsible for the freedom of the Hebrews. God's action frees and saves. The people see and believe. God's actions serve to continue the formation of the people of Israel, who grow in understanding that faith in God is well-placed.

Water is significant in stories of God's saving work. Water recalls God's work in creation. God's promise to Noah was to never again destroy with water. Water also is a physical barrier. Water-crossing imagery is found again in the story of Joshua leading the Israelites into the Promised Land. Crossing through water becomes a metaphor for transformation – a symbol of God's deliverance. Water, as a sign and symbol, is used in baptism today as a means to rehearse God's freeing love through Jesus Christ.

The Exodus stories explore God's relationship with the Israelites. They help to shape them into a people with mission and charge. These stories become a lens for understanding later events in their history, and shape their self-awareness, values, and faith. Their understanding of God as I AM ("I will cause to be") becomes clearer. The exodus journey is associated with God's grace, compassion, and salvation, and becomes a metaphor for hope as they affirm the importance of God's actions in the lives of the people at this time.

The Voice Referendum Polling Centre

Our church has been selected to offer a pre-poll voting centre for the two weeks leading up to the 14 October referendum. We will also be used as a polling booth on the Saturday.

This should not cause any major issues as we have advised the Electoral Commission of our willingness to co-operate so that both parties are able to function effectively during this period. Our involvement in both activities will have implications for our use of the building during these weeks and this may cause some disruptions to normal activities.

Please be aware of the following:

- The church office will be closed between 1st and 14th October and re-open on Tuesday 17th October.
- We will not be able to access the volunteer office during this time at all. Locks will be changed.
- Access to the church building will be impacted between 1st and 14th October. We need to limit access where
 we can so please try to arrange any drop-in visits, jobs or activities in the church building outside of this
 period if you can.
- Sunday morning Worship, Thursday evening worship practice and mid-week pilates classes in the lower hall will be able to run as normal during the pre-polling period. However, on the actual voting day, Saturday 14th October, only voters and AEC staff will be permitted access.
- Note that our calisthenics hirer has not been impacted as she is not holding classes over this period due to it being school holidays.
- Polling places may not display any material about the referendum not provided by the Australian Electoral Commission. This means that no political signage will be going up on our premises.
- If you haven't yet read the information fliers produced by the Uniting Church and you wish to do so, then please ensure you grab any information or fliers about The Voice from our pamphlet display in the foyer this Sunday, before we remove them from the display case and newsletter. Information can always be found on the Uniting Church webpages listed in Wider Church News section of this newsletter.
- Cleaning times have been adjusted over this period. VIP Cleaners have been booked to clean at the following times:
 - o Monday 25th September, between 6 am and 10 am (as per usual schedule).
 - Sunday 1st October, anytime after 3 pm until late.
 - Sunday 8th October, anytime after 3 pm until late.
 - Monday 15th October, between 6 am and 10 am (cleaning times return to normal).

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ,

Following the recent announcement by our Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, I felt the need to write this pastoral letter out of love and grace for all our church, especially as we prepare for the forthcoming Referendum for a First Nations 'Voice to Parliament.'

I am aware there has already been much discussion representing diverse and differing points of view, within both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal Communities about 'The Voice.' At our recent Synod Meeting, we resolved (by Agreement) to 'support the establishment of a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution to empower First Nations People to have a greater say in policy and legislation which govern their affairs.'

I know we are not of 'one mind' on this matter, and there are people struggling to understand and make sense of our Church's support of the 'Voice to Parliament.' The Synod Resolution was made considering the long-standing commitment we, the Uniting Church have in our Covenant with the Uniting Aboriginal Islander and Christian Congress (UAICC). As we seek to embody this covenantal relationship, we are challenged with what it means to be a church that embraces justice, love, equity, and mutual respect.

We are being asked to walk with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples across the country. Our Congress leadership is asking us to be part of this journey, in response to the invitation in the *Uluru Statement from the Heart*. This is a journey that has been decades in the making. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are invited to walk together, not only as First and Second Peoples, but as a family living in Christ.

I am calling our Church to engage with the question being put at this Referendum, with a desire for hope and healing that reflects our experience of God's love and mercy.

Will you pray for our nation, for our church, your local community, your family and friends? Will you individually, and in your services of worship, make this a time of prayer in which we would bless each other in the name of Jesus Christ, regardless of any differing point of view. Rev Dr Aunty Denise Champion reminded me today, that we are family and that as family we don't always agree with each other, however we are still family.

I pray God's peace for you, your families and communities.

On October 14th, Australians will be asked to consider supporting a Voice to Parliament for the First Nations of our country. Through this referendum we will be asked to support a constitutionally enshrined First Nations Voice.

Rev Mark Kickett, National Interim Chair of the Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress notes: 'A constitutionally enshrined Voice will shape and guide the relationship between First and Second Peoples in this country by enabling our people to have a say in the decisions that impact our communities.'

Our Uniting Church members, along with other Australians, are engaging in the conversation about a First Nations Voice and The Uluru Statement from the Heart. We hope this page will be a helpful resource as you consider your response.

New Uniting Church Resource
