A NOTE FROM DO YOUNG

"Finding Nemo, Finding Jesus - Father's day message"

You probably don't know my English name. I officially go by Do Young Kim, but there's a story behind another name I once chose. I remember my first English conversation class at language school. After a simple placement test (looking back, it was quite basic), I found myself in the beginners' group. About ten young non-English speakers sat there, tight-lipped, exchanging nervous glances. You can imagine the atmosphere, right? That's when Jane, our cheerful English teacher, walked in and asked us to choose English names. I pondered for a moment, and suddenly, a name popped into my head. "NEMO," I blurted out, my voice a mix of excitement and nerves. I'm sure I heard a few "Pardons?" before finally making Jane burst into laughter.

You might be wondering, "Why Nemo?" Well, let me share my story. When I first flew to Sydney, Australia - my first long-haul flight of over 11 hours - I was a bundle of expectations and worries. A friend who saw me off at the airport advised, "The fastest way to learn English is to pick an easy animated movie and watch it 1,000 times. You'll end up sounding like a native!" (Sounds exhausting, doesn't it?) Maybe it was because of that advice, but on the plane, I spotted an animation titled "Finding Nemo." Determined to conquer English, I watched it three times that night. As we neared Sydney International Airport, my heart swelled with excitement. "Wow, I'm finally arriving in Sydney, setting foot on new land..." Then, through the window, I saw the beautiful Sydney Harbor and Opera House. It's still vivid in my memory - the moment I realized I was looking at the actual setting of "Nemo," the movie I'd just watched in my cramped airplane seat. At that instant, Nemo became the hero of my life's movie.

It wasn't just about the stunning views. The movie's story resonated deeply with what I was going through. In the film, Nemo, a young fish, leaves his overprotective father, Marlin, craving to see the bigger world beyond his father's shadow. As Nemo starts his journey without his dad, he's thrilled by the newfound freedom but also faces numerous dangers. Marlin's quest to find Nemo is filled with uncertainties and moments of despair, but his unwavering love for his son keeps him going. Eventually, they reunite and reconcile. It's a beautiful story set against the backdrop of a colourful, mysterious underwater world, accompanied by a lovely soundtrack.

What started as a tool for English practice became a turning point in my life. Like Nemo, I wanted to run away from God's calling. I even considered giving up on becoming a pastor in Australia, dreaming of a different life. But God wouldn't let me go. I felt Him searching for me, the runaway, and I began to grasp a fraction of His deep, vast love. So, like the prodigal son returning home, I chose "Nemo" as my English name. In fact, people in Sydney who remember me still call me Nemo Kim. Every time I hear it, I'm reminded of my journey.

As we approach Father's Day, we reflect on the profound journey of fatherhood. It also reminds us of our Heavenly Father. Today, we celebrate all the fathers who give their best for their children. To all the fathers in our church, we wish you a Happy Father's Day. May God's love fill you, as you love your children with strength, forgiveness, encouragement, and unwavering dedication.

CHURCH COUNCIL

Church Council update

- 1. Congregational meeting a date has been set for the next Congregational meeting to be held following the morning service on Sunday 22 September
- 2. Exciting news as two of our young people Hayeon and Tara have been chosen to take part in a Cultural and mission awareness tour to Korea in late November. This tour will help develop relationships between members of the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea (PROK) and the Uniting Church SA. These tours have been occurring since 1992. This year 16 young people will be participating in the tour. Through these friendships and conversations, members of both churches have gained an understanding of being Christian in another culture.
- 3. Our church will be hosting the next Wimala Presbytery meeting at which the 76 member churches of the Wimala Presbytery have been invited to attend. The event will be held on Saturday 12 October from 9am to 4pm. We are being asked to conduct the opening worship component and to provide volunteers to help with morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea. If willing to volunteer please speak with Jeff Dry.
- 4. In the morning worship service on Sunday 15 September we are planning to incorporate a time to celebrate and make welcome some new members to our congregation. More details to follow.
- 5. At this stage over 60 people have booked to attend the Family Fun Night this coming Friday 6 September. Funds raised from the event will be put towards the church fundraising budget.
- 6. In October, Synod will be conducting a state-wide Safe Church Audit for all Uniting Churches and as such Church Council will be reviewing the compliance of all our members to ensure we are providing a safe and welcoming environment. We need to make sure all our church council and key leaders have up to date screenings.
