A note from Rev Do Young

"If you ever feel useless just remember that someone is a lifeguard at the Olympics swimming event." During the 2024 Paris Olympics, lifeguards were once again stationed at the swimming events, just as in previous Olympics. A photo of a lifeguard at the 2016 Rio Olympics swimming event became widely circulated online, along with the caption: "If you ever feel useless just remember that someone is a lifeguard at the Olympics swimming event." The image, which shows a lifeguard seemingly bored and out of place, raised many questions about their necessity but also sparked humour. However, the placement of lifeguards at Olympic swimming events is in accordance with World Aquatics (WA) regulations. Surely, the World Aquatics Federation wouldn't assign lifeguards without reason.



In fact, they are well aware that even top-class swimmers sometimes require assistance. In a sport that pushes the human body to its limits, it's not uncommon for swimmers to suffer from heart attacks, sudden muscle cramps, or even come close to drowning. There have even been instances of swimmers knocking themselves unconscious by hitting the pool wall during a hurried turn.

Lifeguards are there to pull swimmers out of the water and administer CPR if needed. These highly trained professionals remain vigilant throughout the competition. This brings up an interesting question: Wouldn't it be quicker for other swimmers to assist in an emergency? The truth is that during a race where every 0.1 second counts, competitors are too focused on their own lanes to notice anything else. Even swimmers waiting for their turn would struggle to decide whether or not to jump in and help, potentially losing the golden window of time to save a life. There's a reason why lifeguards are stationed at these events, even when the athletes seem almost superhuman.

Watching this photo, I was reminded of a profound truth: God, much like those lifeguards, is always by our side, though we often ignore or forget His presence. The Bible assures us that God is constantly watching over us and is always ready to help when we are in danger.

Hebrews 13:5 reminds us of God's promise: "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." Though we may not always feel His assistance or remember that He is with us, God is constantly playing a vital role in our lives. Unlike the lifeguard in the Olympic swimming event, who might appear bored or unnecessary, God is tirelessly at work on our behalf, day and night. Just because we don't always feel His presence, or because we might try to take the lead in our own lives, we should never ignore or underestimate Him. When we finally experience His touch in moments of crisis, we realize just how essential He is. Rest assured, God never makes mistakes, and He never takes us lightly.

As we go about our daily lives, may we remember the constancy of God's presence and the depth of His love for us. Let us be grateful for His unfailing care and strive to be more aware of His work in our lives and the lives of those around us.
