A note from Rev Do Young

'Peace Wide Open!'

The 2024 Paris Olympics are in full swing, and as I watch the events unfold, I can't help but reflect on the beauty and spirit of this global celebration. The theme of these Games, "Games Wide Open," is all about inclusivity, innovation, and celebration. The Paris Olympics are a showcase of diversity and openness, creating a welcoming atmosphere for everyone involved. The Olympic spirit itself is cantered on fair play, unity, and the pursuit of excellence, bringing together athletes and nations in peaceful competition, fostering mutual understanding and respect across cultures.

If someone were to ask me, "Which team would you support if Australia and Korea faced off in the Olympics?" I would smile and say, "The winning team!" I still remember when I first started learning English in Australia, people would jokingly ask, "What if Australia and Korea went to war—whose side would you take?" My answer was always, "I hope there's never a war. But that's like asking me whose side I'd take if my parents were fighting—how could I choose?" Luckily, it seems that Australia and Korea haven't gone head-to-head in these Paris Olympics yet, and I'm relieved! Even better, both teams are off to a strong start, which brings me double the joy.

But, do you know what makes me even happier? I'm combining the medal counts for Australia and Korea, so in my heart, the "Australia-Korea United Team" is already in first place. It's moments like these that make my position truly special.

Whenever I watch the Olympics or any international sports event, I find myself less focused on the medal count and more interested in the athletes from countries with tense international relations. This year is no different. I'm particularly moved by the athletes from Ukraine and Russia, Israel and their neighbouring countries, and, of course, North and South Korea. Sometimes, we see moments of hope as these athletes shake hands, but other times, they may avoid even making eye contact. We all want to see reconciliation, friendship, and good-natured competition grounded in the Olympic spirit, but it's not always easy.

Why does humanity continue to shape its history through war and violence? What should our perspective be as Christians? I understand how the stories of war in the Old and New Testaments can be confusing. In the Old Testament, war is often depicted as an instrument of God's will or judgment. For example, when the Israelites conquered the land of Canaan, those wars were seen as divinely ordained. However, in the New Testament, the focus shifts from physical war to spiritual warfare. Jesus proclaimed peace and famously said, "Put your sword back in its place" (Matthew 26:52), teaching us to reject violence.

The heart of the New Testament is love and peace. So, as followers of Christ in this New Testament era, we're called to live according to Jesus' teachings—embracing love, forgiveness, and nonviolence. Shouldn't we also view the wars in the Old Testament through the lens of the transformative message of Jesus, who came to make all things new?

As we continue to watch these Olympics, let's pray for a safe and peaceful event, and let's also hope for a world without war and violence—a world where our children can live in peace. "The theme of this Olympic Games is 'Games Wide Open,' but for me, it's really 'Peace Wide Open.'"
