A NOTE FROM DO YOUNG

We live in an era of rapid change. Al and new technologies emerge constantly, and the world moves at a pace that feels impossible to keep up with. In the midst of this whirlwind, our beliefs and values can feel threatened. That is why I intentionally embrace slowness, imperfection, and analogue ways of doing things. One such practice is using a fountain pen.

Over time, I have gathered a collection of 30 fountain pens—some gifted, some discovered at garage sales like hidden treasures, and others purchased to commemorate significant moments in my life. Each pen carries a story, bringing me simple but profound joy. Among them, at least ten are much older than I am, dating back to the 1940s and 1950s. These pens once thrived in their time, shaping history in ways I can only imagine. Perhaps a love letter was written with one, or an important business deal was signed. Maybe it was used to record the joy of purchasing a first home. Alternatively, it could have penned a farewell note, capturing the weight of sorrow. Some of these pens may have even been held by great figures, signing documents that changed the course of history. But with the rise of ballpoint pens, their glory faded. This silent history embedded within them makes me cherish them even more.

Fountain pens require care. They can be messy, and ink can spill unexpectedly. But when I fill a pen with ink, glide it across the page, and hear the soft scratch of the nib on paper, I feel a quiet satisfaction. It's more than writing—it's a ritual. When inspiration doesn't come easily while preparing a sermon, I turn off my computer, select a fountain pen in a prayerful mindset, clean it carefully, and choose an ink colour that matches the season or the mood of the day. It feels like a sacred moment.

Lately, I have taken an interest in old and broken fountain pens—ones with dried ink and worn-out nibs that can no longer write. Instead of simply collecting them, I decided to restore them. I don't have a natural talent for this, but I wanted to give these pens new life, believing that they once held great significance for someone. The challenge was harder than I expected, but when I successfully revived my first pen, the joy was surprising. My hands ended up covered in ink, but I didn't mind—I was happy. Cleaning, adjusting the nib, restoring the ink flow—finally, as ink coursed through the pen once again, I whispered, "It's time for a resurrection."

We, too, can be like these old fountain pens. Our ink may dry up, leaving us unable to write the story of our lives. Our nibs may become misaligned, reflecting the ups and downs we have faced. Our writing may become rough, mirroring our strong will that sometimes resists God's guidance. But just as a pen can be restored—its nib realigned, its ink replenished—so too can we be renewed by God. "It's time to rewrite our story."

We may never know who once held these pens or what words they wrote, but one thing is certain: they were faithful tools in their time. I hope our lives can be the same—offered in faithful service to God.

Last week, Peter stood before Jesus and declared, "I am a sinner. I am yours." May we also confess this truth, entrusting our lives to God, who will write a new story through us.

Even if we are worn, even if our ink has dried, even if our seals have cracked with time, in the hands of our Master, we can be restored, renewed, and repurposed. Just like an old fountain pen, our lives can be made new in God's hands. Do not be afraid to let God's hands get messy in restoring you.

Wirra - Watch and Wonder

Warlta is the Kaurna adjective for warm, hot, clear (weather) and is also the name of the wild turkey constellation that governs the summer season, hence warltati, summer. Normally we refrain from watering in the wirra as local plants survive through this season but we have responded recently to the very dry conditions and sadly we will lose some plants.
