Film Reflection - Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Spy, Martyr

A pastor who was also a spy? And involved in a plot to kill Hitler? Honestly, when I first heard that about Dietrich Bonhoeffer, I had to laugh a little. It just didn't fit the usual image of what a pastor does. But then again, Bonhoeffer wasn't your usual kind of pastor. (Image credit: Canva)



I watched the film "Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Spy, Martyr" on Tuesday at the Norwood cinema, and it's been lingering with me ever since. It's not a fast-paced movie. There's no action, no romance, no laugh-out-loud moments. In fact, at times it might even feel a bit slow. But I think that's part of what makes it powerful—especially during Lent. This season invites us to pause, reflect, and go deeper. And this film does just that.

Bonhoeffer was a young German pastor and theologian who stood up to Hitler and spoke out when many others—including the church—stayed silent. He eventually joined the resistance and was executed just weeks before the end of World War II. It's hard not to be moved by his courage, especially when you realise that he didn't have to do any of it. He had opportunities to stay safe, even leave Germany. But he chose to stay, because he believed following Jesus meant standing with those who were suffering.

One of Bonhoeffer's most famous ideas is something he called "cheap grace." He wrote, "Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ." And in contrast, "Costly grace is the call of Jesus Christ at which the disciple leaves everything and follows him." Those words have stuck with me for years. They've shaped how I understand faith—not as something that just makes life easier, but something that calls us to live with purpose, sacrifice, and love.

Now, here's a confession: I own almost all of Bonhoeffer's books... but I haven't read them all. (I'm sure I'm not the only one!) Watching this film reminded me why I wanted to read them in the first place. Not just because he was smart or brave, but because his life still speaks. It challenges me to ask: what does it really mean to follow Jesus today?

This year marks 80 years since Bonhoeffer's death, and yet his voice still matters. He once said, "The Church is only the Church when it exists for others." I've been thinking about that a lot lately. It's easy for churches to focus inward. But Bonhoeffer reminds us that the Church finds its true calling when it turns outward—when it serves, loves, and stands with others.

In a time when prosperity theology and success-driven faith are gaining ground across the globe, Bonhoeffer's life continues to speak. His witness still challenges us—quietly but firmly—to ask the hard questions. What kind of gospel are we living? What kind of grace are we embracing? His example invites us back to a discipleship that is deep, costly, and profoundly shaped by Christ.

This film probably won't stay in theatres for long. It's not flashy or popular. But it's worth seeing. And if you can't catch it, maybe take a moment to learn about Bonhoeffer's life, or read a page or two from one of his books. You might find, like I did, that even across the decades, his faith and his witness still have something to say.
