A Pink Surprise - Reflections on Mother's Day



Last year on Mother's Day, I did something a bit out of the ordinary—I wore a pink shirt. Pink isn't exactly my favourite colour. In fact, it's probably the one day of the year you'd see me in pink! I thought it would be a nice way to celebrate on Mother's Day, a small gesture to honour the spirit of motherhood. I didn't think much of it at the time, just a simple nod to the occasion. But apparently, it made more of an impression than I realized!

Last Sunday, as I walked into the church that morning, I couldn't believe my eyes. At first, I spotted a few pink outfits and thought, "That's interesting—maybe it's just a coincidence." There was a wave of pink that caught my eye, and I was puzzled for a moment. Could it really be intentional? People were wearing pink—pink shirts, pink scarves, pink ties, even some brand-new pink clothes! There was definitely something different about the atmosphere that morning, but I couldn't quite put my finger on it.

Then, as I stepped up to the pulpit to begin the sermon, it finally hit me. That's when I realized: this wasn't just a coincidence—it was a surprise, and it was for me! The congregation had planned it all behind the scenes. You remembered that one time I wore pink last year and decided to do the same this year as a way of supporting me and having a bit of fun.

Now, to be honest, Sunday mornings for me are usually filled with a bit of nervous energy and a lot of focus on the service ahead. So, I admit, it took me a while to catch on. Even when Lynton mentioned something about a "Memo," I thought he was just talking about a note or a sticky post-it. I didn't realize it had a deeper nuance. Well, I guess I learned something new that day!

But when I finally understood what was happening, I was truly moved. Some of our members even went out and bought new pink shirt just for the occasion! That's when I knew—our congregation is not only thoughtful but also wonderfully creative and just a bit mischievous!

I felt so blessed—and not the least bit alone. Standing there in that beautiful pink wave, I felt truly supported and loved. It reminded us once again why we are so grateful to be part of this community. We could feel God's heart—like a mother's love—embracing us once again.

The Meaning of Pink

Did you know that in Korean, the word for pink is "분홍" (bunhong)? The word itself is quite beautiful.

• 분 (bun) means "fine powder," and

홍 (hong) means "red."

So, 분홍색 (bunhong-saek) literally means "a fine, powdered red" or "a soft, dusty red."

Thinking about it that way made me see that day a bit differently. It wasn't just a bunch of people wearing pink—it was like all our small hearts came together to create one soft, warm, and welcoming presence. Just like fine powder combining to form a beautiful colour, our individual acts of love came together to create something bigger and more beautiful. After the service, a few members suggested that next year, we could add even more meaning to this tradition. Since pink is also the colour associated with breast cancer awareness, why not turn this fun tradition into a way to raise support for breast cancer research? Such a brilliant idea!

I am sure we love how something so light-hearted and spontaneous could grow into something that makes a difference. That's the spirit of our church—taking small, joyful moments and turning them into acts of love and kindness.

To everyone who took part in this year's "Pink Surprise"—thank you. You truly made our community feel seen, loved, and we are definitely not alone. Our creativity, sense of humour, and thoughtful gestures made our day unforgettable.

Next year, we are looking forward to celebrating Mother's Day in pink once again—not just as a nod to our occasional fashion choice, but as a way to support one another and spread love in a meaningful way.

If you wish to join in our online Zoom service on Sunday mornings at 9.30am, you can view the service as it is


